This month we take a look back at the whole season, from the mixed and vets regatta in June all the way through to the Great River Race in September.

## **June**

Once again Clevedon had a significant presence at the Caradon Mixed and Veterans regatta. This has become one of the most important dates on the CPGC calendar thanks to the high volume of top Cornish clubs in attendance, allowing us to race teams usually only encountered at the Scillies and Newquay. In the Mixed event on day one, Clevedon fielded crews in multiple categories including Super Vets (over 50s), Vet (over 40s) and Open (no age restriction). The two junior mixed crews did the club proud, rowing the full adult course, with the A crew finishing 6<sup>th</sup> overall.

Day two is dedicated to the over 40s and 50s. The Ladies Veterans finished 5th overall and the Men's Veterans did brilliantly, finishing in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. The Ladies Super Veterans posted their best ever results, coming in 5<sup>th</sup> in the final. The

Men's Super Veterans were the heroes of the day winning the Plate for the fourth time in a row. Well done, gentlemen!

### **July**

First up in July was Ilfracombe complete with sunshine and the usual rough sea conditions. Clevedon achieved some great results with four crews, Men's Super Vets, Ladies Super Vets, the juniors and Men's A, all coming in 3rd. The best result of the day went to Men's Vets who finished 2nd in their race proving that we are getting to grips with racing in lumpy water.

Next was Teignmouth where the conditions were cold, wet and bordering on hazardous. The Men's and Ladies races took place in extremely challenging conditions, however, the Veterans races had to be cancelled for safety reasons. A disappointing day for Clevedon but, on the plus side, another opportunity to get some practise in difficult waters.

The month finished off with the everpopular Rame regatta. The hosts were on form as always, providing excellent refreshments from their much-envied gig shed, and putting on a great party at the end of the day. In between all the fun some racing took place © However, Clevedon struggled to finish in the top half in most of the races. The Mixed crew put in a fine

performance in their event, taking a number of boats in the last leg of the race.

## **August**

The month kicked off with the Hayle Under-14 regatta. Clevedon fielded two crews: the A crew, our regular band of under-14s, and the B crew, a composite crew which included our youngest rower and a willing under-16 rower. The As won all three of their qualifying rounds to gain a place in the semi-final, narrowly missing out on the final and finishing 4<sup>th</sup> out of 28. A fantastic achievement! The B crew also did brilliantly, winning the plate semi-final, just seven seconds slower than the As. Well done to all of the rowers and coxes. A very proud day for Clevedon.

Clevedon had high hopes of winning this year having come second by just one point in 2014 and set about the challenge with great gusto. The conditions were excellent as we tested our mettle against some of the usual suspects, including Bristol and Ilfracombe. The under-14s put on an amazing show winning their race, and bringing home yet more silverware. Men's B also had a storming race, coming in second and the Mixed crew rowed their hearts out to keep us in the running. The addition of a novice race this year allowed

some of our newer members to get a taste of racing whilst affording us some extra points. Unfortunately we were pipped to the post once again, coming in second to Ilfracombe. Maybe third time lucky in 2016?

### **September**

This has been a very busy month for the club including the Newquay County Championships, the inaugural Clevedon Regatta and the Great River Race, not to mention some fantastic personal achievements by some of our members.

The first event of the month was the Newquay Ladies County Championships. The Clevedon crew were faced with extremely challenging conditions as is often the case at Newquay but put in a fantastic performance. For the second year running they got through to the second round, and finished 45<sup>th</sup> out of 93 clubs, taking a number of scalps including Lyme Regis A and Bristol A. Well done, ladies!
